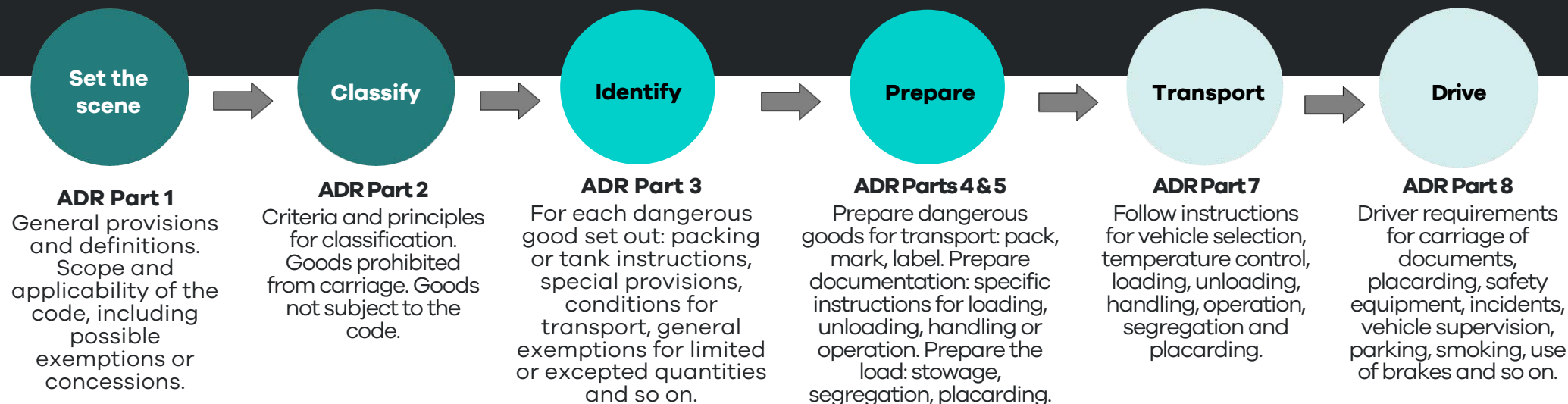

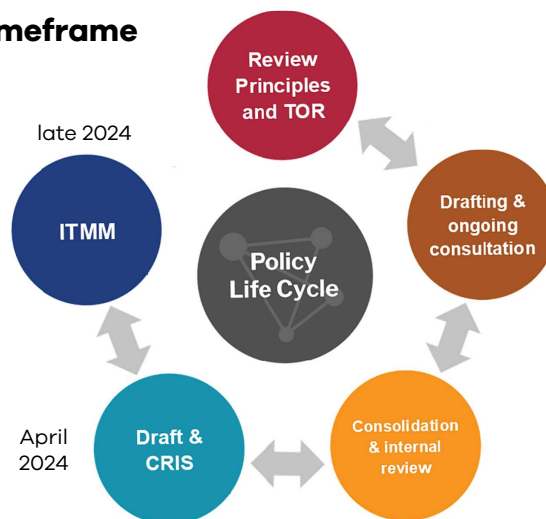


ADG Code review: how, when and why

Key review principles

- Requirements based on international agreements for land transport (ADR and RID).
- Keep unique Australian provisions only if valid and not covered by ADR or RID.
- Vary only if benefits outweigh any negative impact on the code's cohesiveness and functionality.
- Keep Australian methodologies (such as placarding and segregation) but review related thresholds.

Timeframe



Delivering a code that is:

- cohesive
- without contradictions
- structured to follow the transport process
- appropriately balanced between risks and controls
- maintainable into the future
- aligned with international practices.
